

NEW RULES: FIELD HOCKEY NOVA SCOTIA

Appeals



In both the indoor and outdoor leagues a rule was added allowing for the appeal of a reffing decision. The appeal can be made by the team captain.

This new rule helps deter complaints and make correct calls on crucial plays.

9-a-side outdoor adaptation



This year, in order to adapt to summer schedules and allow for 4 teams, the league adopted a 9 a side rule for the outdoor league.

Teams must have a minimum of 8 players and the structure allows for the game to be played up to 11 v 11 depending on availability.

Outdoor Timing



Outdoor matches will consist of two 25 minute halves with a 2 minute half time.

13.3a time and play is stopped after a penalty corner is awarded and re-started when the teams are ready

We did not implement this rule in our league. We do not stop the clock for any situation.



The Nancy Tokaryk Memorial Tust Fund was established in 2008 by family and friends of Nancy Tokaryk, who lost her life in a tragic car accident in June, 2008. Nancy was active in several sports at the recreational and competitive level but notably in the sport of women's field hockey.


The Nancy Tokaryk Memorial Trust Fund was established to commemorate Nancy's contribution to the sport of women's field hockey, her personal leadership and student mentorship, and volunteer community service. Each year a scholarship valued at \$1000 is awarded from the trust fund.

This year the Nancy Tokaryk Golf Tournament had 16 Teams compete at Lost Creek June 21st, 2019. This not only raises money for the scholarship, but is a reunion of the field hockey community in Nova Scotia each year!



This program is geared towards transitioning from indoor to outdoor field hockey. Every Tuesday at 6:30 pm players start with a warm up and skills practice and then divide into teams to compete in league games. Coached by University Alumni, this all-women's league develops players' outdoor skills and knowledge and builds confidence through coaching and practice.

Sticks, balls, and goalie equipment are provided and also available for sale.
